I'm so glad she transferred from our preschool because she is a perfect fit to work with infants and toddlers! Many staff, families and outside people such as our Mental Health Consultant have told Erin that she has a great personality and teaching style for our EHS age group.

Her families are highly involved in the classroom and program because she relays the message of them being important. She has built great relationships with all the EHS families and children. For example, when she had a child who attended Occupational & Physical Therapy and she went with the family to an appointment so she could see what the child was working on.

We started a new Master Teacher position this year and Erin was hesitant to apply since she is a full-day teacher and is in the classroom a majority of her day. With encouragement from her peers and myself she applied and was accepted to be a Master Teacher. She was already mentoring the other KCI EHS Teacher in program requirements and KCI EHS AT with her I/T CDA. She really wanted to be an asset for her mentees and really individualized her mentoring which helped her grow.

Erin is always volunteering her help and looking for resources that will help our families. During these past few months since Spring Break due to Covid-19 we have had to offer virtual services and deliver items to our families. Erin recorded herself reading stories, hosts zoom story meetings during the day and for bedtime for all the EHS families and FaceTimes with the families per their request. She monitored the families ensuring they know she's still here for them. She made art kits, food kits, diaper kits and delivered them to families.

Emily shined in our CLASS observations and Mental Health Classroom observations. Her demeanor and calmness has the kids connect with her in a way no other staff has. It's amazing to see!

She has celebrated graduations, new jobs, & educational milestones with dozens of parents who in some cases had already been counted out by their own families. I have heard from parents years on about how their time at EHS with Selina and her team was a turning point in their lives.
