In the 2024–2025 program year, the Policy Council demonstrated resilience, dedication, and heart—especially during a time of leadership transition and restructuring.

With my Home Visiting Coordinator role expanded to include the Policy Council Liaison, consistent support allowed the Council to remain active and strong. Veteran members helped usher in new representatives, and every KCI site, including Home Visiting now has representation with eleven seated members currently.

This year, our Policy Council engaged deeply in leadership and advocacy. One of our Muldoon parent reps traveled to Juneau in February to speak directly with legislators about the value of Head Start services.

As a military dad, he shared his powerful perspective comparing his KCI experience to services received at his previous Child Development Centers (CDCs), leaving an impression on those he met. His voice carried the real-life impact of our program to those making policy decisions at the state level.

We are especially proud to have three fathers currently seated as parent representatives, an incredible example of male engagement and father leadership within KCI. Our Policy Council also includes a foster respite caregiver, bringing critical insight into the needs of children in foster care. Their contributions reflect a wide range of family structures and lived experiences, making the Council more reflective and responsive to our community's needs.

In addition to regular monthly meetings, Policy Council members supported recruitment efforts at open houses, co-hosted a Policy Council Open House to boost membership, and honored the service of three long-time Community Reps, who were former Head Start parents, who completed their five-year terms. They also participated in the interview process for potential new hires, helping to ensure candidates aligned with both the professional and cultural needs of our families.

They played a visible and vital role in planning and volunteering at the Mayor's Charity Ball fundraiser, proudly wearing their custom "KCI Head Start is Heart Work" shirts. They supported setup, promotion, and shared the heart of our mission with the community.

This year, the Policy Council made many important, program-shaping decisions, guiding the direction of services, reviewing program data, and advocating for families. During our Federal Review in May, several Policy Council members volunteered for both the PC and Parent discussions. The lead reviewer noted how deeply informed and passionate they were, stating, "The parents mentioned how being a part of KCI has been life-changing for them."

That moment captures the spirit of our Policy Council. They lead with love, speak from experience, and help drive impactful changes for our children, our families, and our future. Kathy is also always willing to share her tips and resources with her peers and the Central Office.

Kathy has a creative and intentional approach with staff team building. She goes above and beyond to make everyone feel valued and works hard to create memorable experiences for her team. One example is that during Inservice in Anchorage she rented a car so that all the Kodiak Head Start staff could get around and have a special time together as a team.
